*Using internet sites for research requires a careful judgment of the site's accuracy, authority of the author, and the date of document that you are viewing. If you are looking for quality sites, try using either the **Librarian's Internet Index** or **Internet Public Library**. These are directories of sites that have been evaluated by librarians.*

Using the Google search engine, input the following site title within quotation marks as written here: "**A Jazz Improvisation Primer**." Scroll through it a bit, try out some of the links, and answer these questions:

What is the **complete URL (www address)** of the site:

What is the **title** of the **web document** (the web page) you are viewing:

List the **sponsoring agency of the website** that is hosting the document you are viewing:

What is the **date of the web document** that you are viewing:

Open the **Google** search engine ([www.google.com](http://www.google.com)) or another search engine of your choice. Search for a website that will be useful in researching a topic you're your term paper for this class. Remember that you can use **Boolean operators** (~, **OR**, " ") to help refine your search. You can also use the **Advanced Search** features. From your result list, **choose one site that you might include in your bibliography**. Answer the questions below to analyze the website for its content.
