

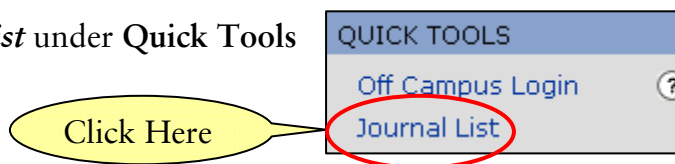
Wozworld Quick Guide to Library Research

Topic: Searching for a Journal by Title

Use these instructions if you already know the name and issue date of a journal (ex. Winter 2006 issue of *Journal of Music Therapy*) that you would like to see. If you are searching for a list of journal articles on a particular topic, check out the Wozworld Quick Guide titled *Searching for Journal Articles by Topic*.

Step 1. Go to the Cook Library web page at: <http://cooklibrary.towson.edu>

Step 2. Click on *Journal List* under Quick Tools



Step 3. Leave the search type as “Title begins with” and type the name of the journal you are looking for in the search box:

Search title words or ISSN:

Title begins with Search

Step 4. From the result list entry, choose an option for viewing the issue that you would like to see. In the example below, the library has some issues in hard copy (print) format and some in electronic format. Electronic issues will have a hypertext link for access.

If you need to see an issue from 1984 or Spring 2002, you must come to the library.

If the issue you want falls between these dates, you can view the electronic copy clicking on the access link.

Keep this in mind --

- The most recent issues of print journals are in the Periodicals Room on Floor 2 of Cook Library. Older, bound copies are classed under the call number listed in the entry and shelved in the STACKS areas on Floors 4 & 5.
- If you choose to view an electronic issue and you are **off campus**, you will first need to log in as a TU user through **ResearchPort**. Have your TU OneCard 14-digit ID number handy to do this.

Step 5. To view an electronic issue, after you click on the database/access link, a new window will open with a list of issues or a search screen to use to search for the issue you need.

From the issue list, select the one you need, and click on it to open that issue's article listing.

From the article list find the specific article you want and click on a viewing format. A PDF copy is a scanned copy of the article as it appeared in the journal; an HTML copy is web-based.

Ah, if only life were perfect.....

Hey, I searched by journal title, but did not see my title listed? What's the deal? If you get a result screen saying "0 records retrieved for ..." next to the title of the journal you searched for, this means that Cook Library does not subscribe to that journal either in print or electronic format. Yes, it is a bit of a bummer, but read on for another option.

That was the perfect article, and I really want it. How can I get a copy of the article if the library does not get that journal? If the library does not subscribe to the journal you need, or does not have a particular year or issue that you need, you can request a copy of the article by using your ILLiad/interlibrary loan account.
